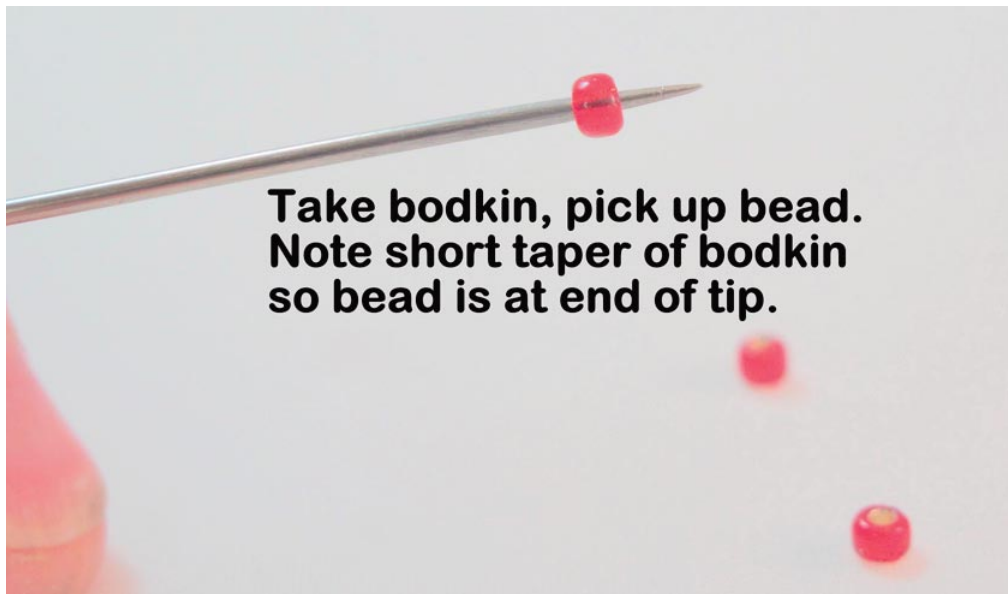

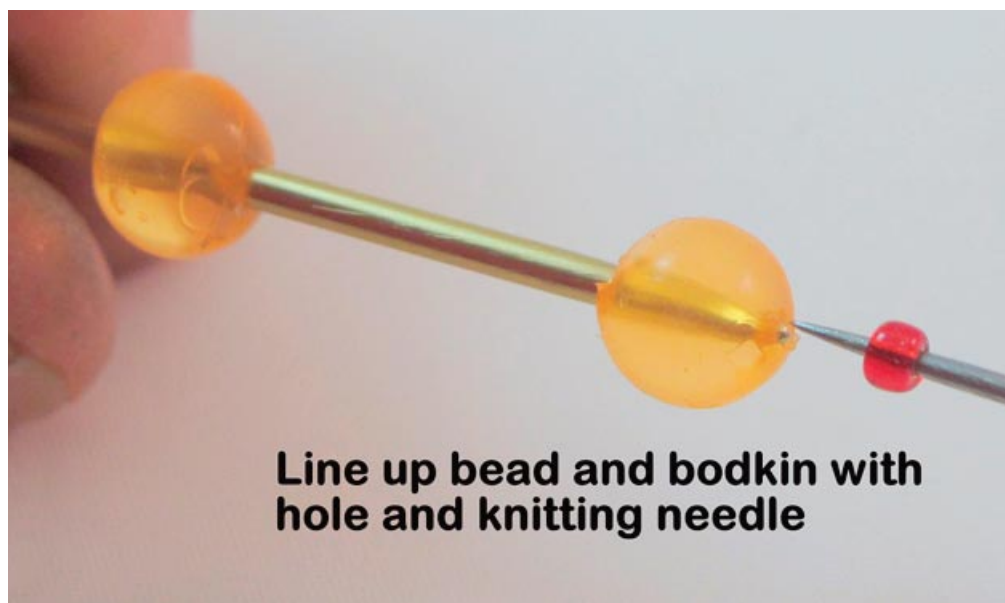

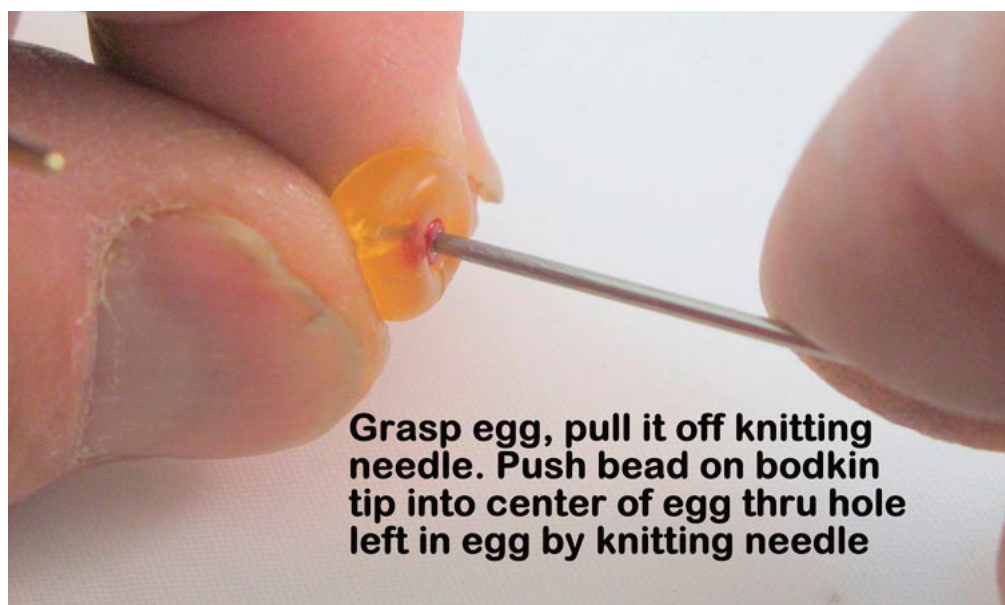

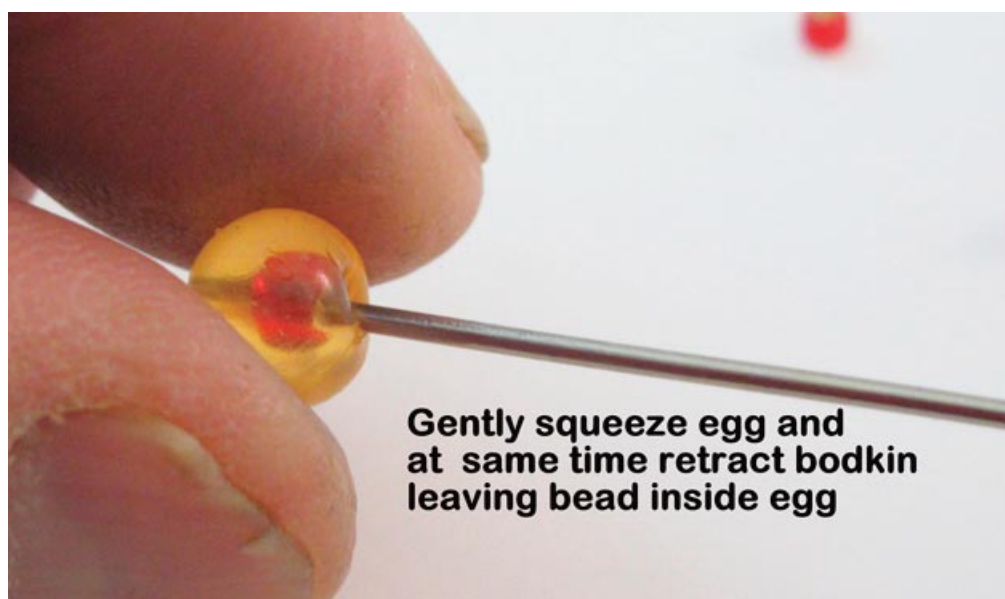

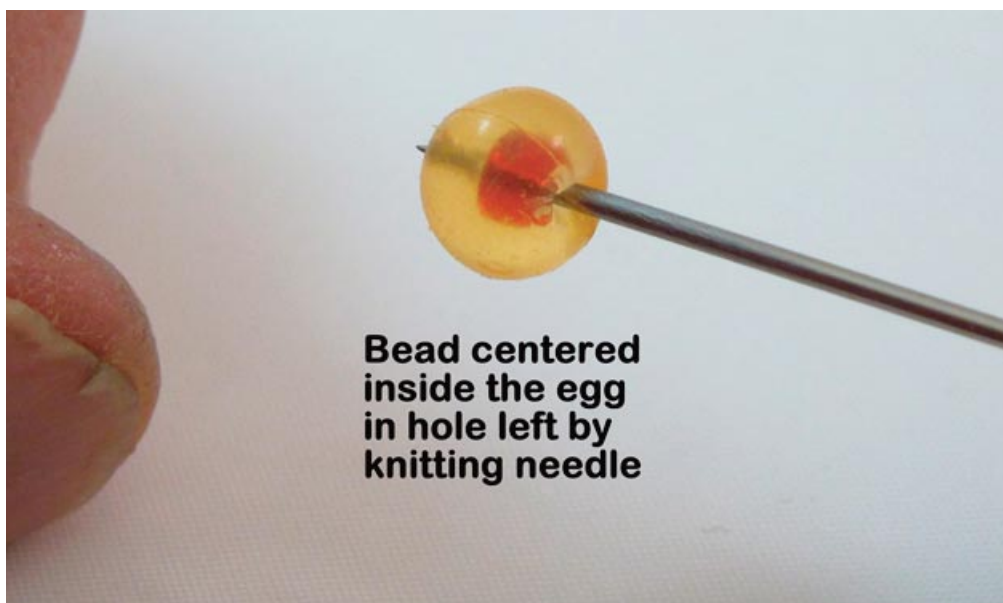

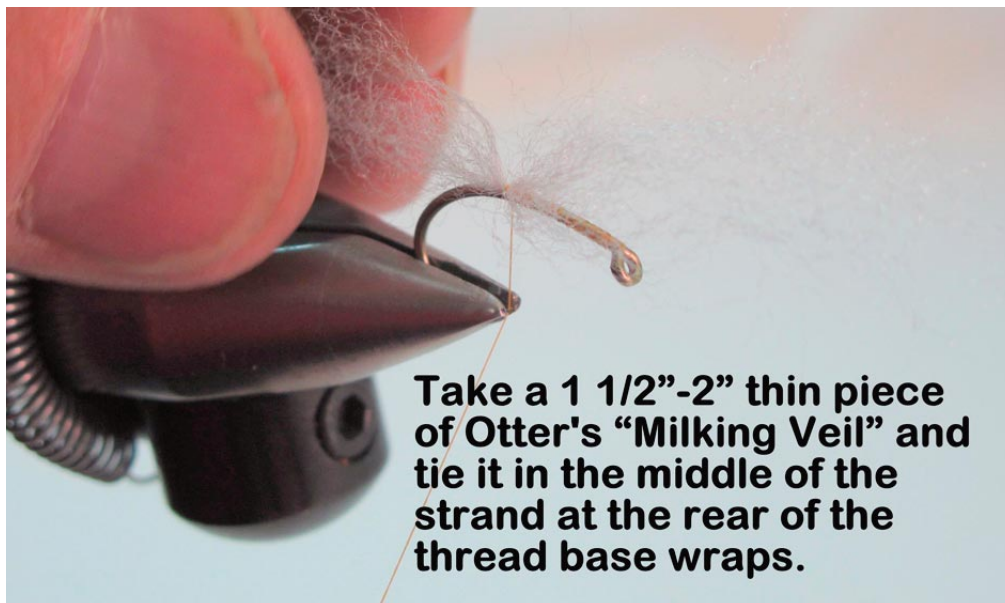
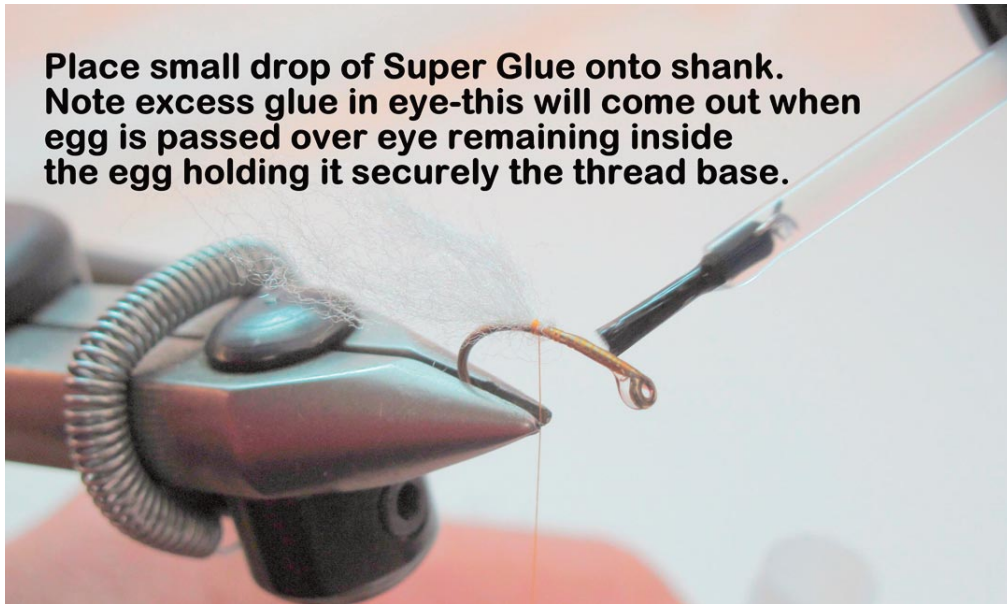

**Place small drop of Super Glue onto shank.  
Note excess glue in eye-this will come out when  
egg is passed over eye remaining inside  
the egg holding it securely the thread base.**

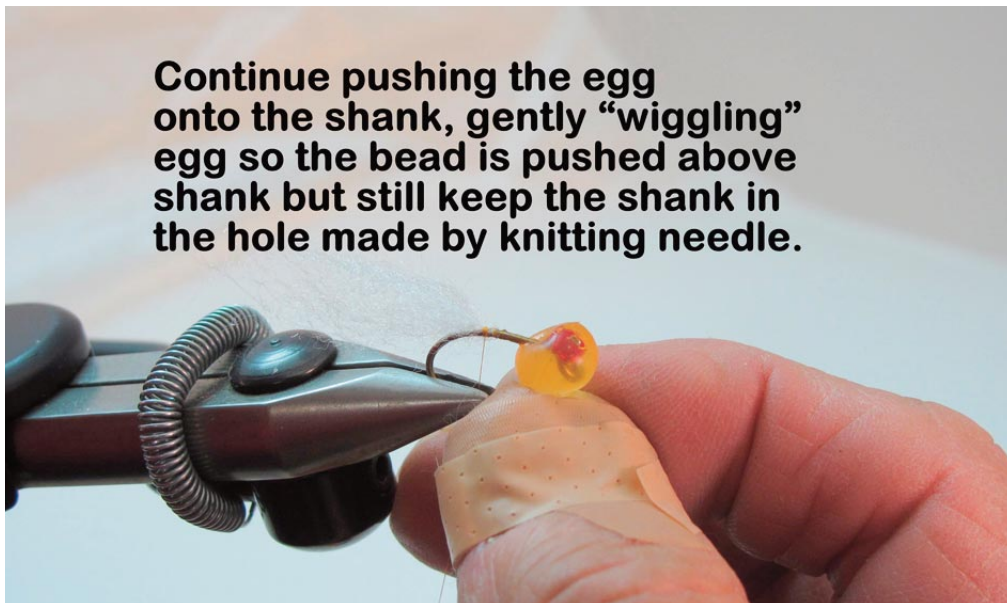
**Gently push the egg onto  
the hook shank using the  
same hole from the  
knitting needle**

**Continue pushing the egg  
onto the shank, gently “wiggling”  
egg so the bead is pushed above  
shank but still keep the shank in  
the hole made by knitting needle.**

**Note that bead has moved above the shank. Continue pushing egg onto shank keeping shank in the same knitting needle hole**

**Egg is now on shank, thru knitting needle hole. Bead has moved up near the outside skin of the egg, realistically and exactly the as a real egg embryo in the river!**

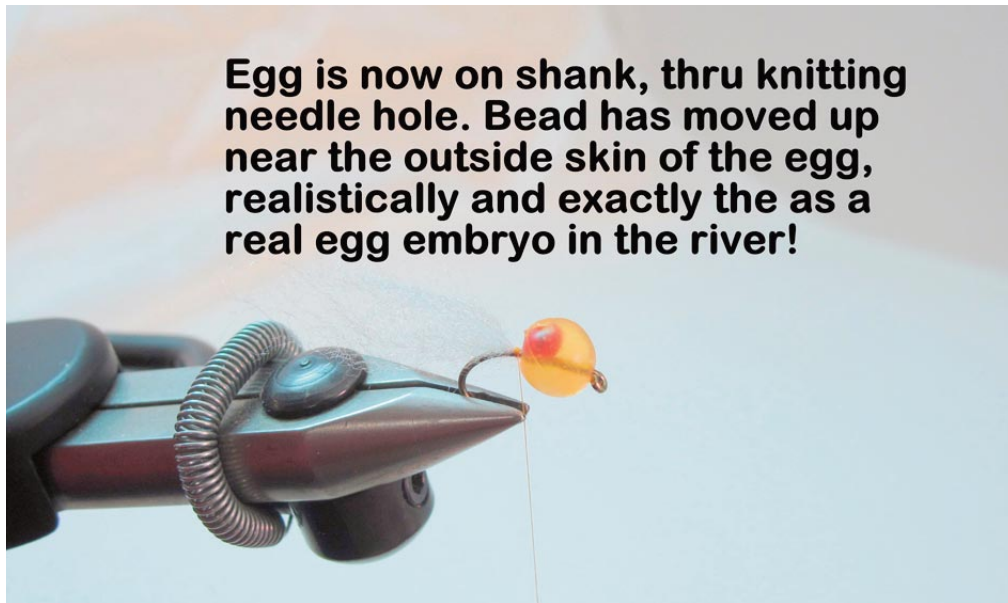

**Pass the thread under the egg and tie off at eye with 2 X wraps**

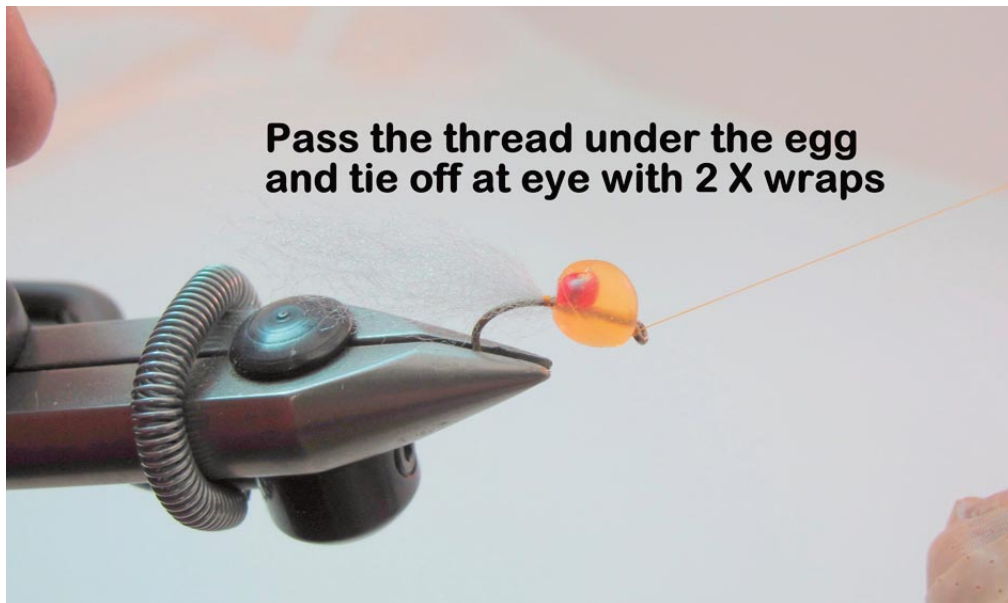

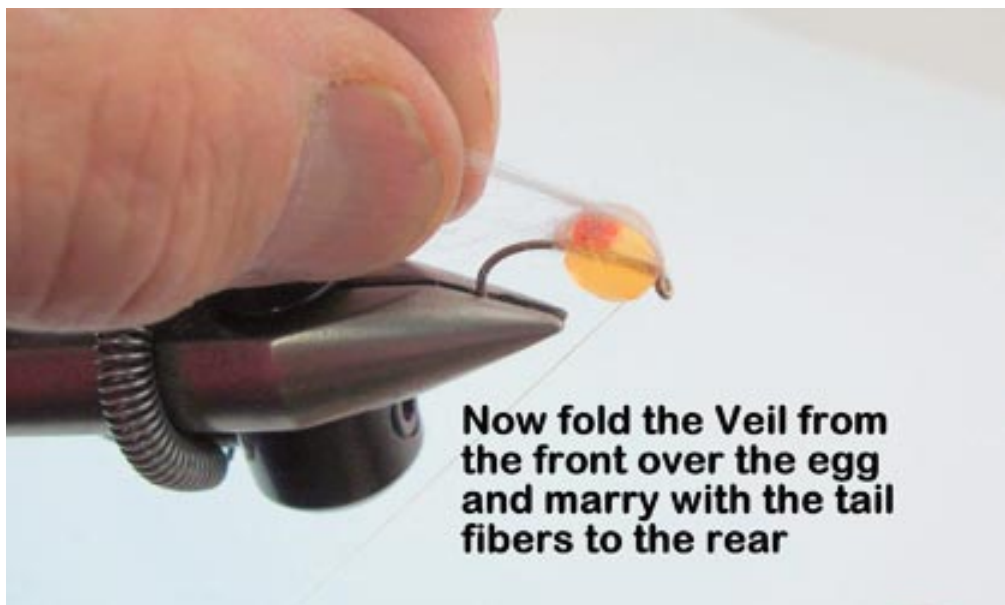
